BRIEF HISTORY OF PAGE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH

Page United Methodist Church had its beginnings in 1877 as the "Page Wission", part of the Methodist Episcopal Church South, Baltinore Conference (there was no Virginia Conference then), Rockingham District. The first pastor was G. O. Homan.

In 1966 the five churches composing the charge— Rileyville, Fletcher's Chapel, Springfield, Oak Hill and Compton - all one-room churches, held a meeting to consider a new modern building that would serve them all.

In 1967 Rileyville, Springfield and Oak Hill approved the merger. Fletcher's Chapel and Compton declined.

In 1968 John and Becky Thomas donated the land for


Ground breaking took place in September 1969.

The first service in the new building took place on Nay 3, 1970.

J. Blaine Blubaugh was the minister at the time Page United Methodist Church was built.

The first person to become a new member of Page
was Gernie Trances Mendows Sours (wife of Guear T.
Sours). Gernie transferred her membership from Main
Street Baptist Church in Luray. Their daughter, Brende
Sue Sours Wyatt, was the first member to join Page on


